# Sweet Tea Brined Pork Loin

Do this then put on a Charcoal grill the words *OMG* do not do it justice  
Sweet Tea Brine for Pork

Pork Loin:

- 2 quarts sweet tea
- 1/3 cup kosher salt
- 1/4 cup Worcestershire sauce
- 12 black peppercorns
- 2 cloves garlic, smashed
- 2 sprigs fresh thyme
- 1 bay leaf
- One 4-6-pound boneless Pork Butt

Directions:

For the pork: Combine the sweet tea, salt, Worcestershire sauce, peppercorns, garlic, thyme and bay leaf in a large bowl or stock pot and stir to dissolve the salt. Submerge the pork loin in the brine and refrigerate for 24 hours.

Before cooking, preheat the oven to 375 degrees F.

Remove the pork loin from the brine and rub with barbecue rub. Prepare the Grill , put on the Indirect heat until internal temperature reach's 160 degrees on an instant read thermometer.

Remove and cover for at least 15 minutes

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
